Lesson Four -- Satan's Many Names

And they had as king over them the angel of the bottomless pit, . . . (Rev. 9:11)

I. In Revelation 9:11 two names are given to Satan: Abaddon ("destruction") and Apollyon ("destroyer"). Satan is the archenemy of God. The name, Satan means "adversary". Other names are used in the New Testament to show his evil nature.

II. Satan's many aliases *Why use an alias? To conceal one's real identity.*

Beelzebub, ruler of demons -- Mt. 12:24	The wicked one -- Mt. 13:19, 38
The enemy -- Mt. 13:39	Murderer -- Jn. 8:44
Liar -- Jn, 8:44	The ruler of the world -- Jn. 12:31, 14:30
The god of this age -- 2 Cor. 4:4 (<i>world culture</i>)	Belial -- 2 Cor. 6:15 (<i>utterly worthless one</i>)
The prince of the power of the air -- Eph. 2:2	The tempter -- 1 Thess. 3:5
A roaring lion -- 1 Pet. 5:8	The adversary -- 1 Pet. 5:8
The dragon -- Rev. 12:7	The accuser of our brethren -- Rev. 12:10
The serpent of old -- Rev. 20:2 (<i>see Gen 3</i>)	The deceiver -- Rev. 20:10

III. What is Satan really like based on the Biblical aliases noted above?
