3. When you think of all the people in Scripture, besides Jesus, who was the greatest example of a servant?
4. Today we talked about the following 4 points:
 - a. A servant’s work is not always glamorous
 - b. A servant’s work never ends
 - c. A servant does not expect to be thanked
 - d. A servant does what is expected
5. Looking at those 4 points - go around the room and share examples of people in the church at Northwest, or from people in your past churches - who exemplify those points.
6. Spend time as you close in prayer for our church, for greater commitment, for our building project, and the money we need to make it happen.
